November 6 on America ReFramed

On a Knife Edge is the coming-of-age story of George Dull Knife, a Lakota teenager growing up on South Dakota's Pine Ridge Reservation. The film traces George's path to activism, inspired by his family's long history of fighting for justice for Native Americans. His focus: shutting down the liquor stores in Whiteclay, a tiny town nearby that exists only to sell beer to the reservation's vulnerable population. MORONI FOR PRESIDENT

November 20 on America ReFramed (NATIONAL PREMIERE)

Every four years, the Navajo Nation elects its president, whom many consider the most powerful Native American in the country. Frustrated about the lack of progress in the reservation, Moroni Benally, a witty academic LGBTQ candidate with radical ideas, hopes to defeat the incumbent president. Suicide is one of the leading causes of death for Alaska Natives. Almost every family has lost brothers, sisters, parents, and children to it. We Breathe Again introduces four Alaska Natives who are trying to break free from histories of trauma and suicide, creating a new, more positive trail for their communities. #WORLDxNAHM #VisionMaker

Inspired by the films *On a Knife Edge* and *The Mayors of Shiprock*, we invite you to share your vision to improve your community.

George Dull Knife, featured in *On a Knife Edge*, envisioned his Lakota community on the Pine Ridge Reservation free from the destructive effects of alcohol. He resolved to shut down the nearby liquor stores that reaped the profits.

Graham Beyale in *The Mayors of Shiprock* envisioned an alternative way for young people of the Navajo Nation to get involved in positive change for the community. He co-founded the Northern Diné Youth Committee.

How about you? What positive vision do you have for your community? Post your vision(s) on social media with the hashtags #WORLDxNAHM and #VisionMaker. Dream big. Don't be afraid to post more than one.

EXAMPLE:



OUR VISION: to provide a positive alternative for Navajo youth to put their efforts into—something other than negative things like gangs or drinking.

TAKE IT FURTHER: Invite others to help you brainstorm a plan for how you might make this vision a reality. What would you need to accomplish it? Who would you need to help?

Once you have your plan designed, start implementing it.

Moroni Benally, Zachariah George, and Alray Nelson from the film ***Moroni for President*** are all inspiring examples of Navajo LGBTQ youth that are fully engaged in the political process.

How do you engage in politics? Do you vote, serve in office, help a candidate, or

something else? However you participate, take a selfie in action and post it on social media with a caption about what you're doing. Your example may just encourage someone else to join in the political process. Be sure to include the hashtags #WORLDxNAHM and #NativeVote.

Historically, Native people are much more likely to vote in Tribal elections than in non-Tribal elections. But as Moroni reminds us in the film, the laws and policies of the federal government, as well as local and state governments, greatly affect the ability for Tribes to exercise their sovereignty. To learn how you can help Tribal citizens exercise their right to vote, check out the resources available through Native Vote, a nonpartisan

initiative by the National Congress of American Indians: NativeVote.org/about/native-vote-resources.

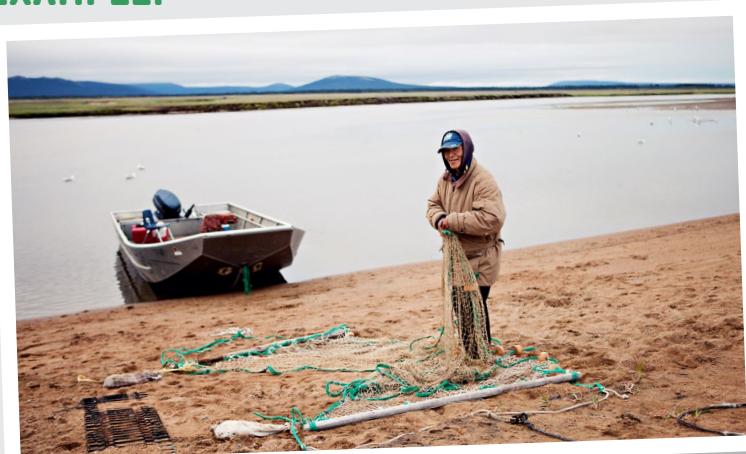
#WORLDxNAHM #WeBreatheAgain #MyStrength

The films *Unspoken: America's Native American Boarding Schools* and *We Breathe Again* remind us of the vital role that culture plays in building individual and community resilience. Centuries of forced displacement and assimilation policies, such as boarding schools, disrupted the transfer of Native culture from ancestors to descendants. The effects have been devastating.

For Earl "Keggulluk" Polk, who is featured in *We Breathe Again*, connecting Native

youth to their cultural heritage is an answer to the alarming suicide rate among Alaskan Native youth. In the spirit of this work, think of something from your cultural heritage that makes you feel resilient. Is there a ritual, song, story, ancestor, place, or something else that helps you feel strong in the face of adversity? Share it with others by posting a photo or video representation on social media with the hashtags #WORLDxNAHM, #WeBreatheAgain, and #MyStrength.
